F1005	Love-Lies-Bleeding Amaranth Seeds - (Amaranthus caudatus) Approx 100 seeds per pack	Magnificent. Long, exotic ropes of rich, red flowers on spectacular stalks. Impressive in the garden and cut fresh or dried. Achieves best color in full sun and poor soils. Grown by Thomas Jefferson as early as 1786. Sometimes called Inca wheat, Amaranthus caudatus was a staple grain for the Incas and Aztecs. Nearly as important in their diets and as widespread in tropical areas of America as was maize (corn). The cereal-like grain (about the size of a poppy seed) is high in protein, and high in lysine, an amino acid usually deficient in vegetables. In fact, amaranth seeds are extremely nutritious, with more protein than most cereals and a better balance of amino acids for the human diet than any other plant. The species is still cultivated in Bolivia, Peru and Ecuador, and now in India for its young leaves and seeds.	\$3.15
F1011	Rocket Candytuft Seeds - (Iberis amara) Approx 100 seeds per pack	Low bushy plants produce abundant brilliant, sweet-scented flowers in a mix of fairy colors all summer. Mounds up to 2' in diameter boast shiny green foliage. A Colonial favorite, Candytuft was always included in the herb garden as a treatment for rheumatism and used for centuries as a seasoning. Because of the extreme ease of its cultivation, it's great for a child's garden. Purple forms of candytuft were in European gardens by the last 1500s when this was known as "Billy-Come-Home-Soon". F1015	Blue Flax Seeds - (Linum lewisii) Approx 100 seeds per pack	Blue Flax is one of the most beautiful, of the all-blue flowering plants with blue-green narrow leaves on graceful 2' tall stems. This native wildflower offers profuse, satiny, sky-blue flowers each morning, from early to late summer. Easy to grow and quick to establish, it will flush with blooms starting its second year. F1021	Pot Marigold Seeds - (Calendula officinalis) Approx 50 seeds per pack	An ancient Marigold, known today as Calendula, is very different from what are commonly called the Marigolds of today - the Tagetes family. The Common Marigold is familiar to everyone, with its pale-green leaves and golden orange flowers. It is said to be in bloom on the calends of every month (the first day of each month on the Roman calendar), hence its Latin name, and one of the names by which it is known in Italy - fiore dognimese countenances this derivation. It was not named after the Virgin, its name being a corruption of the Anglo-Saxan merso-meargealla, the Marsh Marigold. Old English authors called it Golds or Ruddes. F1042	Coconut Geranium Seeds - (Pelargonium grossularioides) Approx 100 seeds per pack	Also called Gooseberry Geranium, has very strong coconut-scented leaves and flowers, low-growing, wide-spreading plants. Blooms late spring to first frost with a trailing habit that works well in hanging baskets, over rocks and walls. Suitable for fresh or dried herbal arrangements, potpourris and for growing indoors. In Victorian times, it was found in parlors, on porches and in gardens. The scented leaves were baked into cakes and confections. Drought-tolerant, good for xeriscaping, easy to grow, needs little attention. Like many fine, old varieties, this fell out of favor as new hybrids were bred, but is being rediscovered and treasured by gardeners in the know.	\$3.15
F1046	Black Hollyhock Seeds - (Alcea rosea) Approx 35 seeds per pack	Silky, dark-purple flowers add a dramatic dimension to gardens and a lovely deep, rose-purple color to herb teas. Like other members of the mallow family, it helps sooth irritated mucous membranes. Described as early as 1629 by John Parkinson, as 'dark red like black blood', it was grown by Thomas Jefferson, and offered by John B. Russe in an 1827 catalog. The elusive maroonish-black color of this old garden favorite has fascinated gardeners for centuries; its height, single flowers and rare color combine to create a riveting presence in the garden. Historical tidbit.... Old fashioned hollyhocks grew tall enough to disguise an outhouse...so were called "outhouse hollyhocks". Since outhouses were an unmentionable subject in Victorian days, visitors knew to look for the hollyhocks when seeking the outhouse, rather than asking where it was!	\$3.15
F1047	Indian Spring Mix Hollyhock Seeds - (Alcea rosea) Approx 35 seeds per pack	Antique English variety which has been grown since at least the early 1500s, possibly earlier. These towering highlights of traditional English cottage and country gardens have 3 to 5 inch blossoms in a range of colors from white to a medium red. In ideal conditions, they can grow to 9 feet tall, bringing interest and drama while drawing the eyes upward. Also excellent as a long lived cut flower for displays.	\$3.15
F1053	French Marigold Brocade Seed Mix - (Tagetes patula) Approx 100 seeds per pack	This charming, cheerful French marigold is the Brocade variety having early and continuous frilly two inch blooms of mahogany red with golden centered blossoms.
